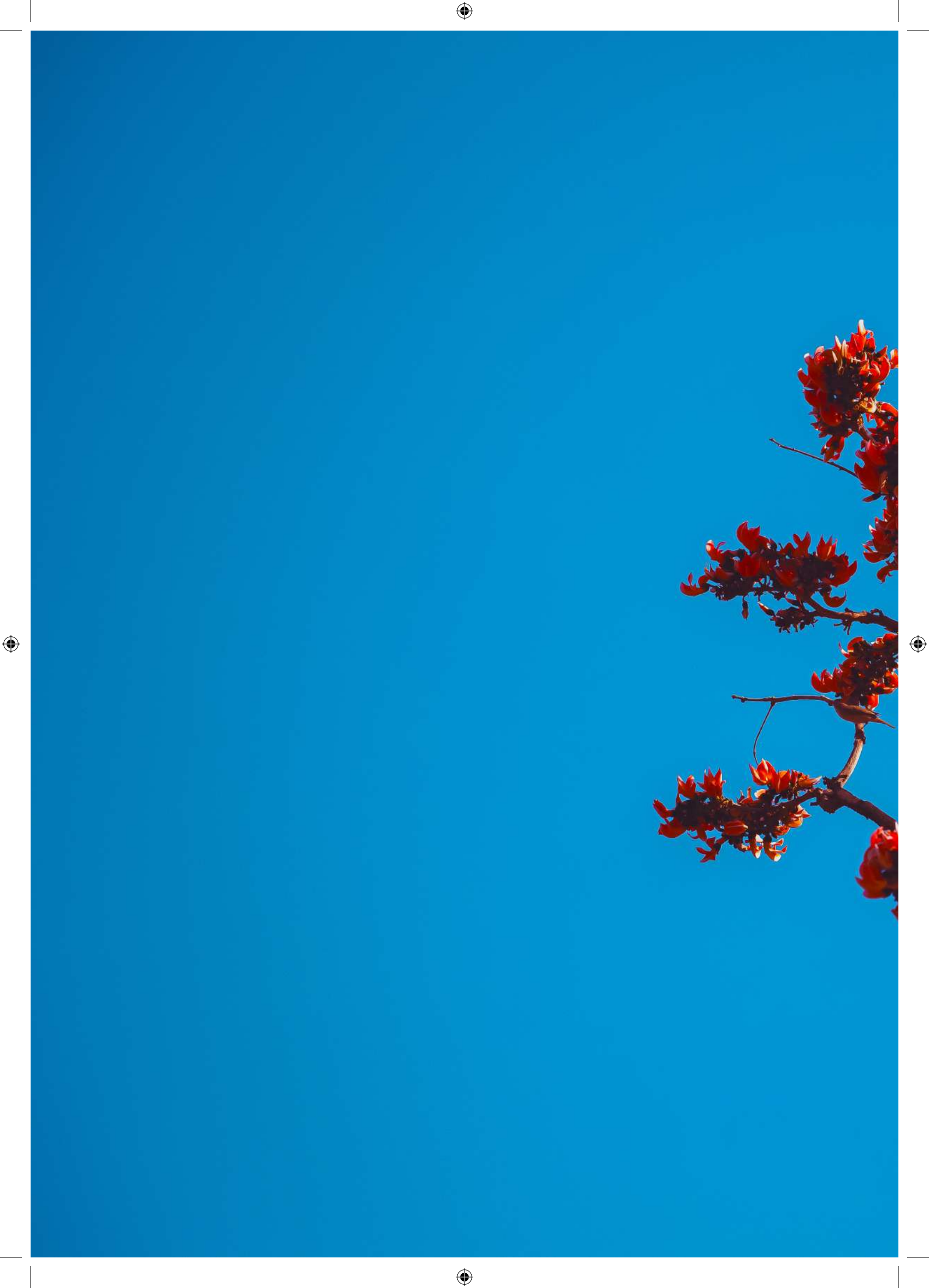

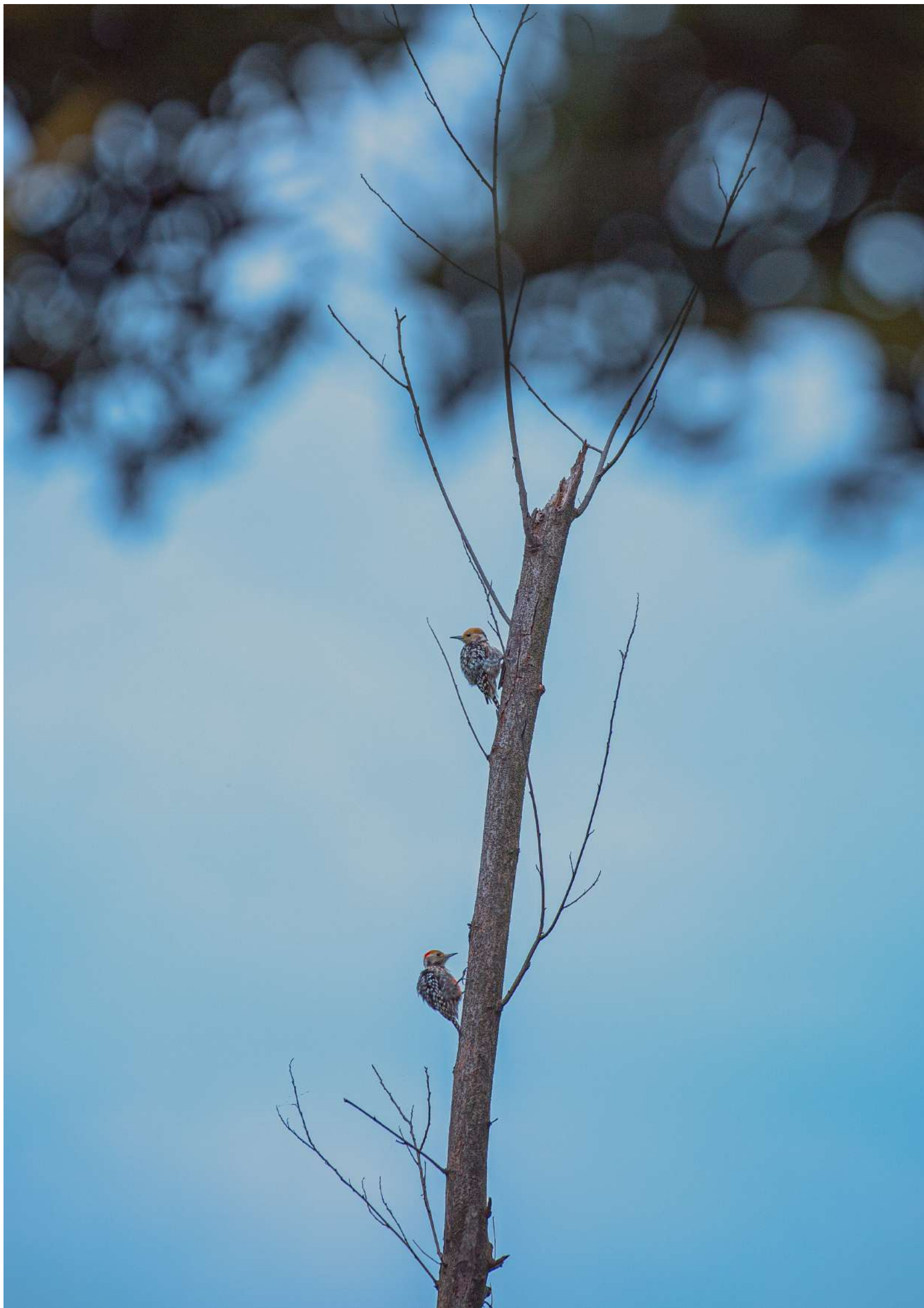

## 1.3 Mandate of the Institute

## 1.4 Act of the NID MP

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National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh was brought under the ambit of the National Institute of Design (Amendment) Act, 2019 (No 38 of 2019) after the assent given by the President of India on 29 November 2019. This designation empowers the institute to confer bachelor's degrees in design "B.Des.", Master's degrees in Design "M. Des." and "Ph.D." degrees in Design.

The National Institute of Design (Amendment) Act, 2019, in conjunction with the National Institute of Design Act, 2014, delineates the institute's authorities, powers, and key aspects of its functioning. This includes provisions regarding teaching, the Governing Council, Senate, funding sources, financial accounts and audits, statutes and ordinances, and other pertinent details.

The initial (First) statutes further elaborate on the Act's stipulations, outlining the powers of the Governing Council, Standing Committee, Director, Senate, faculty streams, education and training programs, fellowship establishment, scholarships, awards, Academic Advisory Committee, Faculty Forum, staff classification, appointment selection committee, performance appraisal system, and more.

In addition, the ordinances serve as the foundational framework governing learning, teaching, assessment, and various facets of the student experience. They play a crucial role in ensuring a uniform and equitable educational approach at the institute, establishing standards and policies that guide the formulation of regulations in areas such as academic integrity, evaluation methods, grading, resource utilization, and student code of conduct etc.

## 1.5 Statutes of the NID MP

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In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 28 and 29 of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 (18 of 2014), the Governing Council of the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh, with the approval of the Hon'ble President of India in her capacity as the Visitor of the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh, has made the first Statutes of the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh. The duly approved Statutes were notified/ published in the Gazette of India, (Extraordinary, Part III- Section-4) vide notification number 24024/59/2022-IPR-V dated 13.04.2023. The Statutes shall be called "National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh Statutes, 2023".

## 1.6 Ordinance of the NID MP

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In exercise of the powers conferred under section 30 and section 31 of the National Institutes of Design Act, 2014 (18 of 2014), the Senate of the Institute has made the First Ordinance of the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh. First Ordinance of the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh, has been notified/ published in the Gazette of India, (Extraordinary, Part III- Section-4).

## 1.7 Management of the Institute

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The management team assumes the vital roles of offering academic and strategic guidance, orchestrating functional coherence, fostering teaching excellence and community engagement. They formulate semester-wise academic schedules, uphold the well-being of both students and employees, oversee the annual budgetary needs, and guarantee efficient administration of the institute's operations and resources.

## STATUTORY BODIES



## 2.1 Governing Council

The Governing Council (GC) serves as the principal executive and policy-making body of the institute. It approves broad academic policies, programs, and oversees the institute's overall operation. The GC comprises a diverse array of individuals, including industrialists with a wide range of experiences, senior government officials, representatives from the institute community, and distinguished educationists from various domains, collectively offering a rich tapestry of perspectives and expertise.

Among its key responsibilities, the GC considers and reviews the annual report, approves the annual, scrutinizes audited financial statements, formulates statutes governing the institute's operations, approves ordinances, and prescribes procedural guidelines for the institute's activities. Additionally, the GC exercises supervisory authority over academic and related functions, assessing student academic performance, monitoring educational advancements, and authorizing the introduction of new academic programs.

The GC is empowered to establish committees as deemed necessary for its functioning and has the authority to engage in agreements with government and private organizations to receive endowments, grants, donations, and gifts on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

One of the critical roles of the GC is to set and maintain academic standards, define the institute's structural framework, and oversee resource allocation. It ensures the institute's financial stability and sustainability by monitoring financial performance and endorsing policies related to financial planning and expenditures. Moreover, the Council is responsible for upholding the integrity of the institute's academic activities and ensuring accessibility, inclusivity, equity, and diversity. Throughout its history, the Governing Council has been steadfast in its commitment to guiding NID MP toward becoming a leading higher education institution in the realm of design education, meeting the diverse needs of its students and stakeholders effectively.

## 2.2 Senate

The Senate, as the principal academic authority of the institute, is responsible for upholding and regulating the standards of teaching, evaluation, and research. In addition, it plays a pivotal role in formulating academic policies to enhance teaching quality, foster collaborative initiatives, and promote endeavors such as intellectual property rights, entrepreneurship, and incubation.

## 2.3 Faculty Forum

A Faculty Forum is constituted by the Governing Council and comprises all teaching faculty members of the Institute. The Faculty Forum convenes at least twice a year, preferably before the commencement of each academic semester. ## Teaching Learning & Academic Programs



### 3.1 Admissions

NID Madhya Pradesh admits students in its four-year Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) program through a centralized Design Aptitude Test (DAT), which comprises two stages. Selection is based on the candidate's performance across both stages of the DAT, designed to assess knowledge, skills, and behavioural abilities. Successful candidates admitted to the B.Des. program are required to complete a mandatory one-year Foundation Program. Allocation of the discipline of choice is determined by the candidate's merit and preference, and is finalised only upon successful completion of the Foundation Program.

- Total number of seats for Indian Nationals (including reserved categories): 75
- Total number of seats for International Students: 11
- Reservation for Indian Nationals: As per the Government of India guidelines

Details of students admitted to the 2024–28 batch are as follows:

The final selection is based on the availability of seats and the candidate's score in the admission process. It's important to note that the admission process is highly competitive and only a limited number of candidates are selected for admission each year.

The breakdown of the 86 B.Design seats (Batch 2024-28) at NID MP is given below:

Note: NIDMP has a total of 11 overseas/ Supernumerary Seats per batch.

All students admitted to the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) program at NID Madhya Pradesh begin their academic journey with the Foundation Studies Program in their first year. Upon successful completion of this program, students are allocated specific design disciplines based on the following criteria:

- Academic performance during the first year (Annual Grade Point Average – AGPA).
- Preferences submitted by the students.
- Availability of seats in each discipline.

This allocation process is designed to promote diversity and inclusivity by welcoming students from across the globe. International students are expected to enrich the institute's cultural fabric, bring global perspectives, and help prepare all students for an increasingly interconnected world.

Based on the order of merit (AGPA), student preferences, and seat availability, the discipline allocation details for the B.Des. 2023–2027 batch are as follows:

## 3.2 Foundation Studies (UG Programs)

### Discipline Brief

The Foundation Studies is geared to assist in developing values, attitudes, sensorial skills and aesthetic sensitivity necessary for specialization in design. It introduces students to the fundamentals of design and orients students to thinking of design as a creative problem-solving process. It helps develop an evolved design perception and attitude, understanding of the multidisciplinary nature of design and relationship of design with environment, culture, human senses and emotions. Basic design studio courses are augmented by developing world views and understanding of the Indian milieu. It helps enrich conceptual thinking, insight for design concerns and design processes. aspires to create an awareness of the changing environment by constantly relating the students' learnings to real-life situations. It provides the necessary directions, stimuli, facilities and experience to foster creativity and thereby help everyone to discover their own identity and potential.

#### B.Des. (Communication Design)

The curriculum covers a spectrum of concepts, including graphic design, moving images and interaction design. The program teaches to communicate complex issues visually, which will influence thoughts and actions. The learner is exposed to understanding content in its cultural, social, ecological and economic context. Students develop conceptual, aesthetic, and technical skills for the creative outcome to solve complex problems in various fields of communication design.

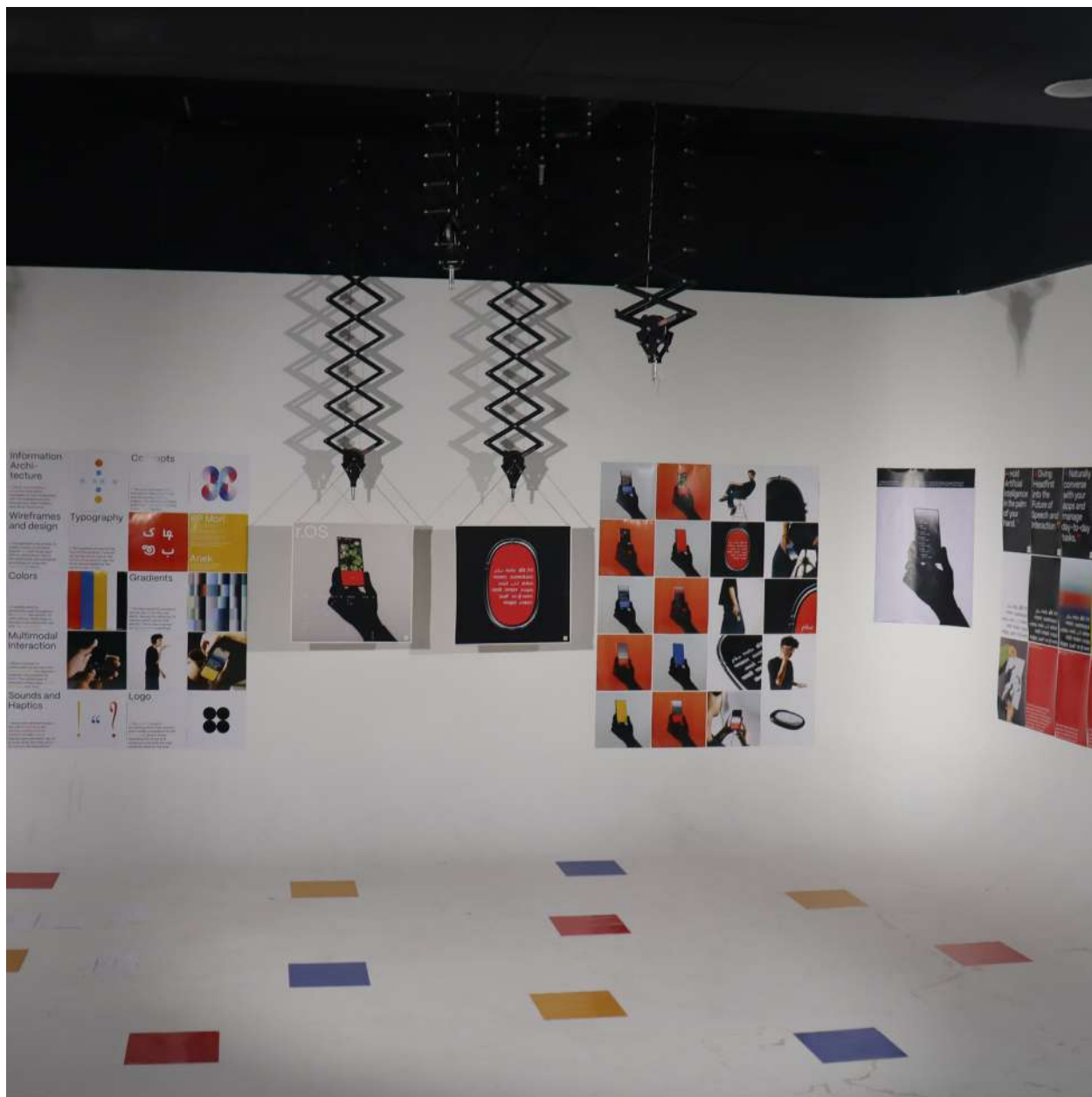

Situated adjacent to the Acharpura Industrial Area in Bhopal, our campus spans 29.49 acres against the backdrop of Vindhyanchal hills.

A brief description about the available facilities is stated below:

- **Administrative Block**

The Administrative Block serves as the central hub for the institute's administrative functions, offering comprehensive support to both students and employees. Within this block, a multitude of crucial offices are housed, each playing a vital role in the institute's operations.

- **Academic Block**

The Academic block features versatile spaces designed to accommodate classrooms, laboratories, studios, and faculty offices. The block houses specialized facilities, including a Garment Construction Lab, Graphic Studio, Sound Recording Studio, and Photography Studio, to cater to a wide range of academic and creative needs.

- **Workshop Block**

The workshop block serves as the cornerstone of our campus, offering a haven for creativity and innovation. Within its walls, meticulously designed dedicated workshops tailored to our specialized streams, catering to the diverse needs of our students, and fostering their talents. There are specialized facilities for Ceramic work, Clay modeling, Wood crafting and Metal fabrication. Here, students have the space and tools to transform their creative visions into tangible, functional, and aesthetically pleasing designs. For the Textile & Apparel Design stream, it provides a hub of creativity and craftsmanship. Our workshops feature the essential tools and equipment for Printing and Dyeing, Pattern making, and Loom weaving. Students have the opportunity to explore the world of fabric and fashion, honing their skills to create stunning textile and apparel designs.

- **Knowledge Management Centre (KMC)**

The Knowledge Management Centre (KMC) plays a crucial role in supporting the research and academic programs of the Institute. Its core function is to identify, evaluate, procure, process, and disseminate learning resources to faculty and students, thereby enhancing their teaching, learning, and research capabilities.

### Modern Infrastructure and Technology

The NID MP KMC is designed to modern standards, featuring a fully air-conditioned and computerized and automated environment.

- **Library Management System (LMS):** The KMC is using KOHA-LMS, an Open Source Software, for efficient housekeeping operations.
- **Institutional Repository (IR):** KMC is utilizing DSpace, an open-source software, to develop an Institutional Digital Repository. This repository is designed to capture and preserve the academic, research, and intellectual output of the Institute. It includes records such as departmental Standard Operating Procedures (SoPs), procedural manuals, photo galleries, newspaper clippings, and both student and faculty achievements.
- **Ergonomics:** The space is furnished with ergonomically designed furniture and fixtures to ensure a comfortable learning environment.
- **Accessibility:** Implementation of RFID technology allows users the convenience of self-check-in and check-out of books during operating hours (9:00 AM to 12:00 Midnight on weekdays).

### Digital Resources and Remote Access

The KMC's website and portal offer a comprehensive range of services to meet the information needs of the entire Institute community. The KMC provides remote access and discovery services, ensuring users can access resources 24/7 both inside and outside the campus environment.

Research support is offered through access to specialized software and high-performance computing resources. They also handle software licensing, hardware procurement, and maintain compliance with academic and budgetary requirements.

Situated on the outskirts of Bhopal, the 16 residential units not only provide housing but also cultivate a spirit of togetherness among employees, creating an ideal environment for collaboration.

The institute places a strong emphasis on the health and well-being of its residents, offering a dedicated health center for basic medical services, and a wellness counsellor who visits regularly to promote mental health and offers support to employees and their families through counseling and therapy.

The Multi Facility Rejuvenation Centre (MFRC) further enriches the living experience, providing an array of options for physical fitness, creative expression, and social interaction. With exercise equipment, indoor sports facilities, musical instruments, and a designated yoga area, the MFRC encourages residents to stay physically active, reduce stress, and enhance their overall health and wellbeing. The open gym offers

opportunities for people of all ages and fitness levels to engage in workouts and exercises.

Additionally, the convenience of mobile ATM banking on campus, along with a mess facility that provides nutrition and diverse meals, ensures that residents have access to essential services.

To foster a culture of learning and knowledge sharing, the institute extends library facilities to its residents, providing access to a wealth of books, journals, and learning materials.

The NID MP library serves as a hub for intellectual and cultural exchange, where employees gather to discuss ideas, engage in meaningful conversations, and expand their horizons. This initiative aims to create a vibrant and intellectually stimulating community on campus, enriching the overall quality of life for residents

## 9.4 Good Practices

A concise note on the best practices followed within the Institute is mentioned here under;

### 9.4.1. Staff Wellness Hour

In Order to improve the overall health, well-being, and spirit of cohesiveness amongst the NID MP workforce, the Institute implemented the concept of 'Staff Wellness Hour' on 16 February 2022. In this initiative, staff members are encouraged to dedicate an hour every week to their own well-being through activities such as sports, games, yoga, reading, Gym, music and hobbies.

### 9.4.2. Monthly Cleanliness Drive:

For the promotion of cleanliness, spirit and hygiene among the staff and the students of NID MP, Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan has been initiated in the Institute. In this regard, 45 minutes (05:15 PM to 06:00 PM) on the last Thursday of every month has been earmarked for Cleanliness Drives or any other event(s) related to the Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan at the Institute Abhiyaan.

### 9.4.3. Fitness Run

A fitness run themed 'Swachhta Hi Sewa' is conducted on the last Tuesday of every month for the outsourced security staff, promoting both physical well-being and awareness of cleanliness.

### 9.4.4. Organic waste converter

As part of its efforts to create high-quality compost manure, the Institute purchased an Organic Composting Machine. The composter uses for composting a variety of food wastes, including vegetables, non-vegetables, eggs, fruit and vegetable peels, and meal leftovers. It emits no wastewater, emits no odor, and exhibits no toxic properties. Various horticultural activities can be carried out with compost manure produced. Compared to the traditional methods of composting organic waste, the composter technology takes fewer hours to complete the processing procedures. Additionally, it helps with the Institute's waste management. Since the machine is fully automated, it saves operating manpower. It can be operated by one person, often on a part-time basis.

### 9.4.5. Wellness Counsellor

The services of an experienced wellness counsellor have been engaged by the Institute on a contract basis to help staff and students improve their mental health, relieve stress, and adopt healthier habits.

### 9.4.6. Bio - medical Waste collection

The Institute has contracted a professional service for the collection of Bio-medical waste

along with used sanitary pads on alternate days and disposal outside the campus in accordance with environmental standards.

### 9.4.7. Meeting with CRs

In an effort to enhance communication and ensure effective resolution of student concerns, the Institute conducts interactive meetings between the Non-Teaching staff and all Class Representatives (CRs), fostering a collaborative environment and strengthening student support mechanisms.

### 9.4.8. AAGAAZ

A special initiative 'AAGAAZ' was launched under the theme of "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav". As part of the said initiative, the Institute has provisioned 20 bicycles (10 men's bicycles and 10 women's bicycles) for its students, employees, and other stakeholders to provide a convenient and eco-friendly mode of transportation within the campus.

### 9.4.9. Free Yoga classes

In an effort to promote physical and mental health, reduce stress, and foster a sense of well-being among employees, free yoga classes are conducted by a volunteer internal resource person on all working days.

### 9.4.10. Suo Motu Discloser

In compliance with the implementation of Suo Motu Disclosure under Section 4 of the RTI Act, 2005, the Institute has updated the Suo Motu Disclosure webpage on its official website to enhance user accessibility. The webpage ensures the retention of previously relevant information, orders, circulars, etc., and is regularly updated to maintain transparency and accountability.

### 9.4.11. Cyber Jagrukta Diwas

In compliance with the observance of "Cyber Jaagrukta Diwas (CJD)" on the Wednesday of the first week of every month, the IT Section of the Institute circulated a user-level checklist of do's and don'ts among the employees to promote awareness and contribute to the development of a cyber-secure ecosystem within the Institute.

### 9.4.12. 24\*7 Ambulance Services

The Institute provided a 24-hour Ambulance Service (on hiring basis) at the campus to address medical emergencies and provide round-the-clock assistance to the students, employees and staff.

#### 9.4.13. National Knowledge Network (NKN)

01 Gbps National Knowledge Network (NKN) link was satisfactorily commissioned for the Institute on 03rd January 2025. National Knowledge Network (NKN) is a multi-gigabit national research

and education network, whose purpose is to provide a unified high speed network backbone for educational and research institutions in India. The network is managed by the National Informatics Centre.

## **Opinion of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the Accounts of National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh for the year ended 31 March 2025**

### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of National Institute of Design (NID), Madhya Pradesh, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 March 2025 and the Income and Expenditure Account/Receipts and Payments Account for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 25(2) of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014.

This Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards, disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions regarding compliance with the Law, Rules and Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency cum performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through inspection reports/ CAG's audit reports separately.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements of National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh, read together with the accounting policies and Notes thereon and matters mentioned in the Separate Audit Report, which follows, **give a true and fair view** of the financial position of the autonomous body as at March 31, 2025, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2020.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with the CAG's auditing regulations/standards/ manuals/ guidelines/guidance-notes/orders/circulars etc. Our responsibilities are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the autonomous body in accordance with ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the financial statements**


The Governing Council of the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2020 and for internal control as management determines it necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.



### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion in accordance with CAG's auditing regulations /standards/ manuals guidelines/ guidance-notes/ orders circulars etc.

**Separate Audit Report on the Accounts of National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh  
for the year ended 31 March 2025**

**A. Balance Sheet**

**A.1 Capital Fund and Liabilities**

**A.1.1 Depreciation Fund (Schedule-6): ₹9.62 crore**

As per the Significant Accounting Policies of the Institute, depreciation is calculated on straight-line method for items, namely, Buildings (2.50%); Machinery, Equipment & Tools (10%); Sports Equipment (10%); Furniture and Fixtures (10%); Library Books (10%); Computers & Peripherals (20%) and Computer Software (40%). Further depreciation on additions during the year has been provided for full year irrespective of date of acquisition.

However, since the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2020 do not prescribe the rates of depreciation, the Institute should have followed the rates specified under the Income Tax Act, 1961 as stipulated in the Uniform Format of Accounts for Central Autonomous Bodies. Further, depreciation on assets purchased during the year should have been charged on 'pro-rata' basis as specified in the Uniform Format of Accounts. The details of depreciation charged by the Institute vis-a-vis depreciation chargeable as per the Income Tax Act, 1961 is given in **Annexure-I**.

Thus, charging of depreciation on the rates which are different from the rates specified under the Income Tax Act, 1961 and non-charging of depreciation on assets purchased during the year on 'pro-rata' basis has resulted in understatement of Depreciation Fund and overstatement of Capital Fund by ₹1.29 crore.

The issue was also raised in the Separate Audit Report for the years 2022-23 and 2023-24. However, corrective action in this regard was yet to be taken.

**A.1.2 Earmarked Funds (Schedule-2): ₹28.08 crore**

**Establishment Expenses (Schedule-14): ₹7.05 crore**

As per the Significant Accounting Policy no. 1 (b) given under Schedule-17 of the Annual Accounts of NID, Madhya Pradesh, the financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting except for liability towards privileged leave.

This is in contravention to the provisions of Accounting Standard-15 (Employee Benefits) which requires measurement of liability towards leave encashment on the basis of actuarial valuation. Moreover, NID, Madhya Pradesh got the actuarial valuation of liability amounting to ₹99.69 lakh on account of Terminal leave benefits as on 31 March 2025, however, the same was not recognised in the books of accounts.

This resulted in understatement of Establishment Expenses and overstatement of Surplus by ₹99.69 lakh each.

The issue was also raised in the Separate Audit Report for the year 2023-24. However, corrective action in this regard was yet to be taken.



## **A.2 Assets**

### **A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule-6): ₹129.61 crore**

#### **Capital Work in Progress: ₹111.46 crore**

The above includes capital works of NID Madhya Pradesh campus. As per the records, payments aggregating to ₹112.23 crore (excluding interest) to NBCC (India) Limited and ₹1.36 crore to Central Public Works Department (CPWD) had been made till 31 March 2025. Out of these payments, NID had capitalised ₹1.71 crore<sup>1</sup> till 31 March 2025 and ₹0.42 crore had been shown as Capital Advance in respect of NBCC. The remaining amount of ₹111.46 crore had been shown under Capital Work-in-Progress.

The campus was inaugurated virtually in February 2019 and the facilities had already been put to use, and the batches for all four years (Bachelor of Design Degree) had already commenced on or before 31 March 2025. As the Institute had become fully operational on or before 31 March 2025, the whole work should have been capitalised.

This resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets and overstatement of Capital Work-in-Progress by ₹111.46 crore, with consequential impact on depreciation.

The issue was also raised in the Separate Audit Report for the year 2022-23 and 2023-24. However, corrective action in this regard was yet to be taken by the Institute.

## **B. Management Letter**

Deficiencies which have not been included in this Separate Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Management through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

## **C. Assessment of Internal Controls**

### **(i) Adequacy of Internal Control System**

The internal control system was not commensurate with the size of business/transactions in the Institute, as evident from the fact that during the year 2024-25, only two meetings of the Governing Council (10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> meetings) were held on 24.04.2024 and 15.07.2024, instead of at least four times in a year as per the National Institute of Design Act, 2014. Further, accounting of capitalisation of assets and charging of depreciation needs to be strengthened.

### **(ii) Adequacy of Internal Audit System:**

The Internal Audit for the year 2024-25 was not conducted.

### **(iii) System of Physical verification of Fixed Assets:**

Physical verification of Fixed Assets was carried out by the Institute during the year.

### **(iv) System of Physical verification of Inventories:**

Physical verification of Inventories was carried out by the Institute during the year.

**(v) System of payment of statutory dues:**

The Institute was regular in payment of undisputed statutory dues during 2024-25.

**(vi) Other matters relating to functioning of the entity:**

A reference is invited to clause 6 (h) of Schedule 17 of National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2020, which provided that the Gratuity is charged to Income and Expenditure Account on the basis of actuarial valuation and the same is contributed to the NID Employees' Gratuity Fund. Though, NID Madhya Pradesh created the provision towards Gratuity, the same was not contributed to the Employees Gratuity Fund as per the requirements of the aforesaid clause 6(h). This led to non-compliance with the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2020 to that extent.

**D. Grants in aid**



The Institute had an unutilised balance of grants amounting to ₹0.03 crore as on 1 April 2024 and it received grants amounting to ₹13.46 crore under different heads (General: ₹5.36 crore, Salary: ₹6.97 crore, and Capital: ₹1.13 crore) from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry during the year 2024-25. Out of the total grants amounting to ₹13.49 crore, the Institute utilised ₹12.22 crore (General: ₹4.45 crore, Salary: ₹6.97 crore and Capital: ₹0.8 crore) and surrendered an amount of ₹1.02 crore during the year. As on 31 March 2025, the unutilised amount of grants was ₹0.25 crore.

**Notes Forming Part of Accounts**

**1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:**

**a. BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS:**

The Annual Statement of Accounts and Balance sheet of the Institute are prepared based on the National Institute of Design, Madhya Pradesh (Forms of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules 2020 notified by the DPIIT, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India vide Gazette notification no. G.S.R. 822 (E) dated 30.12.2020.

**b. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:**

The Financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting except for liability towards privileged leave.

**c. INVESTMENTS:**

Long Term Investments are stated at cost.

**d. FIXED ASSETS:**

Fixed Assets are stated at the Cost. The cost includes invoice value, freight, octrol, and other incidental expenses relating acquisition.

**e. GOVERNMENT GRANTS:**

- (i) Government grants are accounted on the basis of sanction from Government Department.
- (ii) Government grant to the extent utilized towards capital expenditure, are transferred to the Capital Fund.
- (iii) Government grants for meeting Revenue expenditure are treated as income of the year to the extent of expenditure incurred.
- (iv) Un-Utilized grants are carried forward and exhibited as a Liability in the balance Sheet.



## **f. DEPRECIATION:**

### **(i) RATE OF DEPRECIATION**

Depreciation is calculated on Straight Line Method at the following rates, as adopted by the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad:

- (ii) Depreciation on addition has been provided for the full year irrespective of date of acquisition.
- (iii) An amount from the Capital Fund account was transferred to Income and Expenditure account to the extent of depreciation provided on assets acquired out of capital grant.
- (iv) Depreciation is not provided for assets sold during the year.

## **g. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTION:**

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted for at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction. The bank balance held in foreign currency is converted into Rupee at RBI rate prevailing on the closing day of the financial year.

## **h. CURRENT ASSETS, LOANS AND ADVANCES:**

In the opinion of the Management, the current assets, loans and advances have a value on realization in the ordinary course of business, equal at least to the aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.

## **i. INCOME TAX:**

The income of the Institute is exempt under the Income-tax Act 1961. No provision for Income Tax is therefore made in the accounts.

## **j. RETIREMENT/TERMINAL BENEFIT**

Terminal leave encashment benefit to the employees is accounted for on a cash basis. Gratuity is charged to Income & Expenditure A/c on the basis Actuarial valuation and the same is shown as provision under the sch 5 "Current Liabilities".

## **k. Revenue Income**

- (i) Various fees/charges being received from Students, except "student activity fee" and "Mess charges", are treated as income for the year.
- (ii) The net balance of "Student Activity fee" and "Mess Charges" is treated as current liability for the year and shown in Sch 5.
- (iii) Interest earned on STDR is accounted for on an accrual basis for the year.

- (iv) The revenue utilized towards the recurring expenditure, if any, incurred during the year has been shown at Sch 14 & 15 under the column "Non-Plan recurring expenditure".

#### I. CORPUS FUND

NID MP Corpus fund has been credited with the portion of revenue earned during the financial year as shown in Sch 2 through Sch 16.

2. Contingent Liability for the year is ₹ NIL (Previous year ₹ Nil).
3. Estimated amount of contract remaining to be executed on capital account and not provided for ₹ 27,40,550/- (Previous year ₹ NIL/-) for construction of additional infrastructure.
4. The matching amount of actual project expenditure for the ongoing projects has been taken as project income under Sch 11 "Income from Project receipts/Grants (Non Plan) & Expenses from projects (Non Plan)" to give true and fair view of the Balance sheet and Income & Expenditure account for the year.
5. The 'Other Administrative Expenditure' for the year includes an amount of Rs 3,58,179/- as prior period expenses which could not be provisioned for in the accounts for the year 2023-24.
6. The Refund of Capital Advance has been adjusted from 'Capital fund' (Sch 1).
7. Deficit for the year 2023-24 of ₹ Nil/- (For the previous year ₹ NIL) has been debited to misc. expenses, as there is no specific govt. grant received for the same during the year.
8. Corresponding figures for the previous year have been re-grouped/rearranged wherever necessary.
9. Figures in the Final accounts have been rounded off to the nearest rupee.
10. New minor/sub head under various schedules have been included for better presentation of the Schedules and Annual Account.
